

- English as the second language of: <u>600 mio. people</u>
- half of the 10 million most frequently used apps are in English
- the strong imprint of language : <u>trading in the financial markets</u>

<u>General Facts 2.0</u>


- English is the dominant language of: <u>the United Kingdom, United</u> <u>States, Canada, Australia, Ireland, New Zealand, and various island</u> <u>nations in the Caribbean Sea and the Pacific Ocean.</u>
- English is a global lingua franca =
- (a language used for communication between foreigners)
- English is taught as a foreign language in over 100 countries.

Old English

The earliest form of English was known as Old English, spoken until about the 11th century.

Middle English

 Middle English emerged after the Norman conquest of 1066 and was spoken until the late 15th century.

Modern English

 Modern English began to develop in the 16th century and has continued to evolve since then to the present day.

- 1492 Discovery of America by Columbus
- Columbus thought that he had found India
- Native Americans = American people
- First Nations = Canadian people
- Expulsion and violence against Native Americans
- Many Europeans wanted to immigrated to the United States after Columbus

- Founding of the colony of New South Wales in the 18th century
- by English navigator Captain James Cook.
- he named the first British colony in Australia.



<u>India</u>


Spread/History of the English language in India
